The true foundation of Cheverie's style is what I consider to be extremely consistent and even skills distribution across the board. In every area of the game, from head to toe, he's very fundamentally sound. But his size is clearly more of the sleek, aerodynamic and "reactive" hybrid butterfly style, as opposed to the big bulky "blocking" butterfly goalies. Cheverie appears very upright and narrow due to his single-break Iceberg graphics, narrowed Vaughn chest protector and extremely sharp footwork. He did not play with any intensity this week - it was a very laid back camp. But he executed very well and displayed the same skills that made him a Hobey Baker Finalist just a few months ago. If he competes hard in camp, an AHL gig is in reach.

Strong glove positioning and speed. A combo of active/blocking styles.

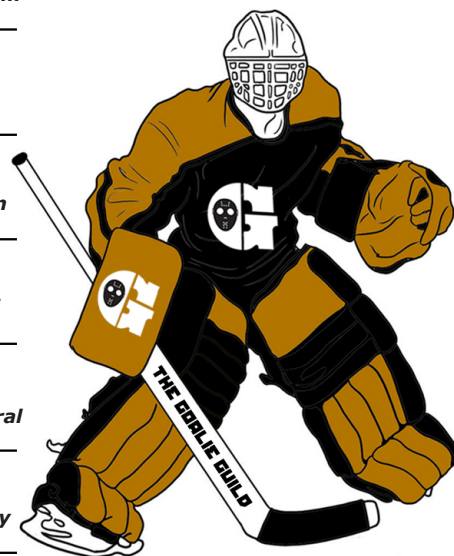
GLOVES

Mental	Has a calm and composed mental game. Great situational awareness and focus on the puck. Labored or visibly sighed after giving up bad goals. Part of this was a laid-back camp atmosphere. Is not easily distracted, but did show frustration.	79	30%	23.7
Attitude	Cheverie's attitude was positive throughout the week. He was not in the most competitive state of mind, playing in a laid-back manner due to the nature of the camp. He competed as you would expect him to. He was enthusiastic and alert all week.	80	15%	12
Skating	Marc's footwork is one of his best assets. He's sharp, consistent and pushes laterally with little effort. He gets from point A to point B in a powerful manner. He snaps to angles and that allows for a quick recovery. He can still improve in these areas.	82	15%	12.3
Mobility	Because of his strong footwork, his mobility is very strong as well. He's a quicker, smaller goalie that has the ability to shuffle and power slide behind second and third opportunities. His quickness also allows him to display great patience on rushes.	84	10%	8.4
Angles	Although he didn't do a great job of challenging shooters, Cheverie still rarely lost his angles during drills. His struggles stemmed more from rust and bad timing, not positioning. He needs to play higher and set his feet instead of sliding back.	79	10%	7.9
Legs	Impressive pad work throughout the week. Was rusty on Monday but his rhythm and footwork improved each day. Needs to improve overall strength, but has the speed and efficiency to compete at the NHL level. Very solid skills all around.	75	10%	7.5
Hands	Glove hand is stronger than blocker side. Likes to keep blocker tight to his hip, but the elbow will flare out to eliminate space. More reactive with his glove, more positional with the blocker. Has above average puck handling and passing skills.	78	10%	7.8
