Cory's first road game of the year was a 3-1 win in Colorado. He didn't face a shot until 5:25 into the game after the Canucks already had a 1-0 lead. His first big save was made moving laterally to his right and absorbing a shot up high. That became the theme of his game, as he was positionally perfect all night. He stopped all eight shots in the first and all 12 in the second. Right after Vancouver went up 2-0, he made his best save of the night. It was a patient glove save on Matt Duchene's breakaway backhand at 16:10 of the second. Schneider had the demeanor of a starter and was even-keeled all night long. He was always in position, square to the puck and extremely patient. I loved how he stood up to make several saves. Was finally beat with 3:08 left in the game. He was paddle down, but the stick got pulled out of his hand and couldn't get his arms across in time. He stopped 33 of 34 shots.

Glove was rarely tested but made a huge stop on a Matt Duchene breakaway in the second period.

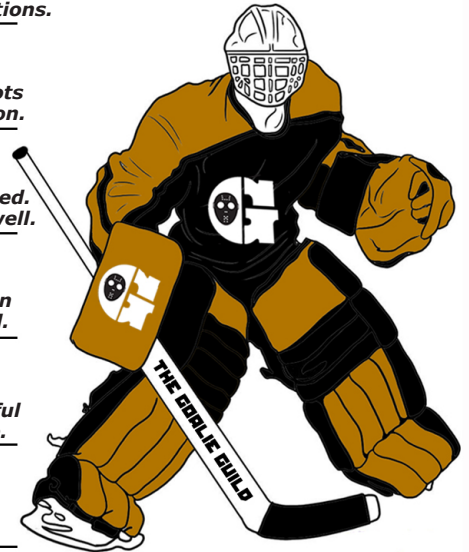
GLOVES

Mental	Showed tremendous composure despite not seeing any shots in the first five minutes. Very even-keeled. Did not overreact in any situation. Brought a conservative approach mentally and maintained a consistent disposition throughout the 60 minutes.	85	30%	25.5
Attitude	His body is calm, but I could tell his mind was activated and he was very focused. He radiates calmness and composure, similar to what you see in Jaro Halak. Doesn't show a lot of animation because he focuses on displaying poise and being responsible.	86	15%	12.9
Skating	Schneider's skating ability in this game was all focused around balance and power. Because he stays upright, has a very strong core and a big frame, his footwork is very strong. This lets him move quickly around his crease while still staying fully square.	85	15%	12.75
Mobility	Cory will not wow you with his quickness and agility, but his game thrives on power, positioning and precision. He will want to work on his quickness and reactionary speed in both the feet and hands in order to further improve his goaltending abilities.	83	10%	8.3
Angles	One of the more impressive aspects of his game was the ability to absorb most shots in the chest and not give up a rebound. His angles were dead on and he was in the zone. He was consistently at the top of his crease and never caught too deep.	87	10%	8.7
Legs	Another one of his strengths are the streamlined body. A strong core leads to strong legs which leads to powerful skating skills. He brings an established presence to the crease. His excellent balance means he's rarely knocked around or falling backwards.	88	10%	8.8
Hands	Although I feel his hands could be a little more active, the combination of strength and speed allows him to get hands behind the puck in a quick and square fashion. His best save in the game was a glove save on a Matt Duchene breakaway.	82	10%	8.2
