Whether it was Cedrick Desjardins getting a chance to exact revenge on his former organization or James Reimer making it into a handful of games to ring in the new year, a lot of goalies took full advantage of their opportunities and made a case for their future NHL jobs.

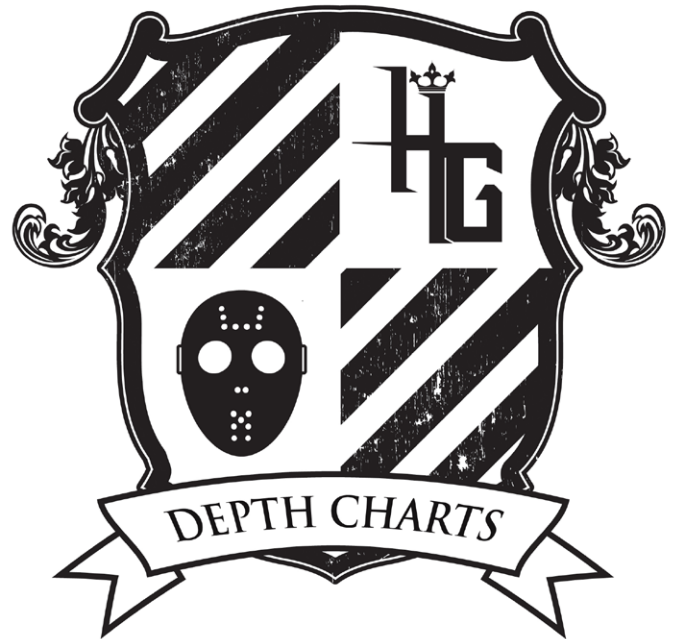
On the flip side, a few prospects suffered from demotions. Thrashers prospect Ed Pasquale was sent down to Gwinnett (ECHL) in late-December to split time with Chris Carrozzini, who was struggling mightily. Boston's Michael Hutchinson was sent to Reading in exchange for Matt Dalton.

A little more on the surprising side, Detroit sent former first-round draft pick Thomas McCollum down to Toledo (ECHL) to regain his confidence, while Jordan Pearce was the beneficiary and got to experience some AHL action to begin 2011.

December was also another month of discontent for Predators prospect Chet Pickard. He received a recall to Milwaukee and played well in three games for the Admirals, but was sent back down to Cincinnati on 12/21 and ended up right back where he started the month.

Maybe the most movement in a team's depth chart in December, however, came on the Island. Dwayne Roloson was shipped off to the Tampa Bay Lightning and that vaulted Nathan Lawson into the full-fledged backup role behind Rick DiPietro. But when DiPietro suffered an adductor strain, it was Kevin Poulin who was given his first taste of NHL action.

In Tampa, it was Desjardins making headlines by winning his first two career NHL starts and almost pitching shutouts in both of them. Roloson's arrival logjammed the crease, so only time and Mike Smith's return from injury will tell us how things will smooth out in the Sunshine State. ~ J. Goldman
