OCTOBER 2010 UPDATE

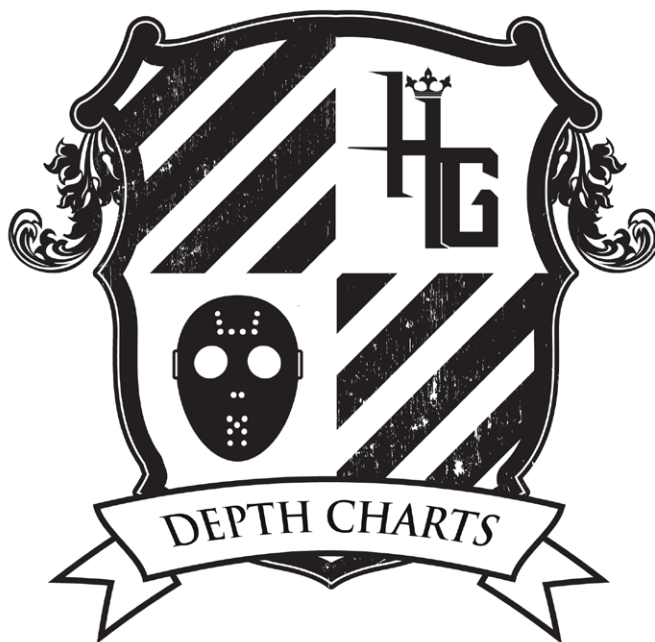
Last month, we proudly introduced our NHL Goaltending Depth Charts as the newest feature within The Goalie Guild's premium scouting services. Thanks to the inclusion of our Alteration Marks, it was a very exciting release that took normal depth charts to a whole new level. It was met with a lot of positive feedback and for all of those that took a gander at our charts, we truly appreciate the support!

With the start of the regular season finally here, we are very excited to have made the first-ever updates to the Depth Charts. We had to add a handful of goalies to the list, including San Jose's newest prospect J.P. Anderson, Dallas' Adrien Lemay and Washington's Brandon Anderson. Unrestricted free agent Jose Theodore was signed by the Wild after Josh Harding went down with an unfortunate knee injury, so he was slotted into the #2 spot in Minnesota as well.

As you saw in our Top-100 Prospects Rankings update for October, a number of goalies also improved their positioning within their team's depth chart, as goalies like Sergei Bobrovsky, Eddie Lack and Nashville's new backup, Anders Lindback, made drastic leaps in the month of September. Upright arrows and eyeballs all around for those guys, as both Bobrovsky and Lindback found a way to crack an NHL roster without even having a single game of experience in North America.

In Columbus, David LeNeveu is the beneficiary of a knee injury to Gustaf Wesslau, who is expected to miss most of October. As such, he has taken over the starting role in Syracuse for the time being. Other injury concerns include Semyon Varlamov in Washington, which puts Michal Neuvirth in the elusive #1 spot to start the season.
