

JANUARY 2011 UPDATE

What better way to ring in the new year than by announcing a change in the #1 overall spot for the first time ever?! Well, take a look below, and you'll see that Jon Bernier has succeeded the spot to Cory Schneider.

From there, many adjustments were in order due to the 2011 World Junior Championships. With a number of our prospects playing on the biggest stage of their life, we learned a lot about the potential and upside of goalies like Jack Campbell, Joni Ortio, Robin Lehner, Olivier Roy and Mark Visentin.

We also offer up the final ranking of Corey Crawford, Sergei Bobrovsky and Devan Dubnyk, all three of which have graduated from our list for good. We feel Crawford (10th) is just a bit more valuable than Bobrovsky (11th) and that Dubnyk holds quality value at 31st overall.

In the Top-20's, you have to be excited about the rise of Kevin Poulin and Martin Jones. Both goalies are rookies in the AHL but have had sensational starts to their season and have played their way into more games than anyone expected. Poulin even received his first career NHL start on 1/8/11 right here in Colorado. And even though Mark Dekanich's first taste of NHL action didn't go as well as he would have liked, he still vaults into the Top-20 due to his pristine play in the AHL.

When it comes to some of the prospects sliding down the list, none is more obvious than Oilers prospect Olivier Roy. Not only was he victimized for a number of weak goals in the World Juniors, we found that his butterfly is very restricting, something that may not allow him to be successful at the higher levels. Chet Pickard also dropped 10 spots due to his inability to sustain any confidence and consistency in the AHL.

Eddie Lack, the AHL Goaltender of the Month for December, received a solid boost into the mid-40's and James Reimer now sits 34th overall after three very positive showings for the Maple Leafs. ~ J. Goldman
