

JUNE UPDATE

With the summer now underway and the midway point of Stanley Cup Finals taking place hitting on June 8, The Goalie Guild is proud to publish our first and only Top-125 Prospects Rankings. This is the first of two steps as we go from tracking 100 to 150 goalies that have started 25 NHL games or less.

Maybe the most influential and significant movement took place just a day before publishing the June rankings. Ilya Bryzgalov, who has been one of the more productive goalies in the NHL over the past two seasons, had his rights traded to the Flyers.

Automatically, this really elevates the long-term potential of both Mark Visentin and Louis Domingue. Ironically, both goalies were signed during the month of May and will return to their junior teams for one more season.

At the same time, this deal also adds fuel to the fiery rumors that the Coyotes are interested in Viktor Fasth. But due to the IIHF transfer agreement with Swedish prospects, the Coyotes only have until June 15 to sign him.

A few other cause-and-effect movements have had a significant influence on our rankings. Mike Murphy, who had an exceptional AHL playoff run with the Checkers, has the chance to take over Carolina's #3 role if he can take it away from the to-be-demoted Justin Peters.

In Colorado, Calvin Pickard elevates his potential role in an Avalanche uniform due in part to the organization's decision to pass on Brandon Maxwell's rights.

In Philly, not only did the Bryzgalov news influence Phoenix's prospects, but now I have adjusted Joacim Eriksson and Niko Hovinen to reflect their current upside. Eriksson could be re-drafted this summer, but if not, he'll keep sliding.
