

OCTOBER 2010 UPDATE

The NHL regular season is finally here, and that means we roll out a full-blown round of updates for our Top-100 Long-Term Prospects Rankings. The past four weeks was a very active and exciting time for many goalies, as relatively "unknown" prospects became household names to keeper and one-year fantasy managers. And thanks to the opportunities that come during NHL training camps and pre-season games, a handful of goalies shot up the ranks.

First and foremost, Sergei Bobrovsky revealed his legit long-term talent by impressing scouts everywhere with his foot speed and overall quickness.

In the Western Conference, Vancouver Canucks prospect Eddie Lack gained confidence early during the Young Stars Tournament and rode the wave of momentum all the way through the pre-season. His play not only pushed David Shantz out of the AHL picture in Manitoba, but also put Tyler Weiman's comfortable role as the Moose's starter in jeopardy.

Anders Lindback, who stands at 6-foot-6, didn't make the biggest leap this month, but vaulted eight spots and is now ranked #10 overall. As such, it acted as the most significant rise in September. Not only did he have a strong training camp, but his pre-season play knocked Mark Dekanich out of the #2 spot in Nashville's system and ultimately won the backup role to Pekka Rinne.

Jhonas Enroth also returned to the Top-10 ranking thanks to a couple of excellent pre-season games in which he showed great composure and durability. He continues to make Patrick Lalime an expendable veteran and we feel his strong pre-season will go a long way in boosting his potential.

Big Ben Bishop took a giant step forward in his long-term potential during the pre-season, thanks in large part to a 32-save shutout over the Colorado Avalanche. We happened to be scouting that game and were very impressed with his ability to make saves in the slot area with such a big frame.

All of these goalies and more stood out in the last month and truly deserve recognition for their great play and stellar development! - Justin Goldman
